## His Produce

Galatians 5:16-26

*Our Scripture passage today tells us of a kind of fruit born by the Spirit of God as He works in our lives. The Apostle Paul contrasts the Christian life with the life lived in the flesh. Let's look at some principles regarding fruit of the Spirit.*

### **1) Fruit is something produced .**

#### **1) The process of nature .**

Fruit is something produced because of what we are. It is illustrated in nature. A seed catalog advertised "vine peaches." Reading the fine print, I found they are small cantaloupes. Peaches don't grow on vines. The reason is simple: they are peaches. We don't tell a tree what kind of fruit to bear. It is nature that decides. The Bible recognizes this and uses the principle to enforce lessons (Matthew 7:16-18, James 3:12).

#### **2) The process of grafting .**

A tree can't change its fruit unless there is a grafting. We can't bear fruit in the Spirit by our energy alone. We only bring frustration on ourselves when we try and fail. Galatians 5:22, 23 is not a series of commands or even exhortations. It is a list of promises.

#### **3) The process of the Spirit .**

What is the source of fruit? It is determined within the tree or vine, the energy within produces fruit. It is the natural result of sun, rain, and the nature of the plant. The Christian has a special energy within enabling him to do what he can't do on his own. It is the Spirit of God. It comes as a gift of God's grace.

### **2) Fruit takes time to develop .**

#### **1) Don't be ruled .**

Do you remember your first experience with persimmons? There is a difference in tasting an immature one and one that has been given time to mature. It can't be

rushed. To some, the Christian life may seem hard and joyless at first. As maturity develops, the love and joy God wants us to experience become apparent. We must not give up too soon. It is a mistake to expect "instant change" in our lives or others. It can happen, but seldom does. It is also a mistake to think God is finished with you after a certain time. Your life may still bear fruit.

## **2) Don't be frustrated .**

God can and will do a work in our lives if we allow it. Even now, He is changing us (II Corinthians 3:18). Changing someone into the image of Christ can't be hurried, especially considering the raw material some of have to offer Him. He can't be satisfied with less than perfection.

## **3) God is faithful .**

Don't get frustrated if your life doesn't seem to be changing fast enough. Everything happens in God's time (James 5:7, 8). God can grow a squash in a few weeks. Oak trees take hundreds of years. Time blends into eternity and the process of growth can be extended forever.

## **3) Fruit bearing requires cultivation .**

### **1) The requirement .**

The first requirement is an earnest desire to bear fruit for God. God plants His seed everywhere, but only some are receptive (Matthew 13:1ff). Seek to minimize resistance to truth, shallow relationships, and anxiety about the things of the world to provide an environment for growth and production. Fruit grows in the light, so we must live in the light (Ephesians 5:9)

### **2) The blend .**

II Peter 1:3-11 shows the blend of Divine and human effort required to bear fruit. He has given "everything we need for life and godliness," and "great and precious promises." He made us "partakers of the Divine nature." Yet, He expects us to "make every effort" to add Godly attributes to our character. We are promised we will never fail if we do these things. V. 10.

## **Conclusion**

The practical conclusion: How can we bear fruit in the Holy Spirit?

Make a conscious decision and active effort to live "in the Spirit" and not "after the flesh." At the same time, realize we can't succeed without God's help. Surrender life and will to Him. Bible study, prayer, self-examination are extremely important. Those who truly desire to be more like God will be helped to achieve that goal.

A certain farmer bragged about a stalk of corn he had preserved by storing it in his barn because it had 7 ears of corn on it. It had grown from one kernel and had produced thousands of kernels. Don't you wish you could bear fruit in your life as abundantly as that stalk of corn? I remember the days in Illinois when farmers thought 100 bushels to the acre was a good yield for corn. Now, 200 bushels is considered a poor crop in some places. Those farmers have proven the more work, study, and planning you put into farming, the more prosperous you will be.

The same is true in the spiritual realm. If we really want to bear fruit for the Lord, we will be enabled to do so through effort, study, prayer, etc.

## ***How Can We Bear Fruit? Renewed in the Spirit***

One of golf's immortal moments came when a Scotsman demonstrated the new game to President Ulysses Grant. Carefully placing the ball on the tee, he took a mighty swing. The club hit the turf and scattered dirt all over the President's beard and surrounding vicinity, while

the ball placidly waited on the tee. Again the Scotsman swung, and again he missed. Our President waited patiently through six tries and then quietly stated, "There seems to be a fair amount of exercise in the game, but I fail to see the purpose of the ball."

That's the way it is in the church sometimes. It seems like we get so busy doing churchy things that we forget our dependence on the Holy Spirit. If we are to accomplish anything with any eternal significance, we must depend on Him.

Someone said, "If a man is filled with anger, then anger controls his life. If a man is filled with greed, then greed dominates his life. If a man is filled with lust, then lust governs his life. If a man is filled with love, then love influences all he does. And if a man is filled with the Holy Spirit, he is controlled by the Spirit - it is, if you will, 'control by consent.'"

Years ago on a variety show, one of the guests for the day was a body builder. As he entered the stage with his huge muscular body the crowd went crazy as the body builder began to flex his muscles and show his power. The first question asked of him was this: "What do you use all those muscles for?" Without answering, the body builder again stood up and began flexing his muscles while the crowd cheered wildly.

A second time, the question was asked, "What do you do with those muscles?" Again, the body builder flexed his muscles and the crowd became almost ecstatic.

After asking three times, "What do you do with all those muscles?" the body builder just sat in silence and had no answers. The man was all power but his power had no purpose other than to show off and bring attention to himself.

Evangelist D. L. Moody was once asked why he urged Christians to be filled constantly with the Holy Spirit. "Well," he said, "I need a continual infilling because I leak!" He pointed to a water tank that had sprung a leak. "I'm like that!" he said. It's a fact that living in this sinful world we do need to be replenished by the Spirit. Another evangelist was asked if he believed in the "second blessing." "Of course I do," he replied, "and in the 3rd, 4th, 5th blessing, and so on."

We are reminded in Scripture to allow the Holy Spirit to renew us daily. Because we leak. We need Him to fulfill our purpose.
