Exercise Your Faith

A few years ago the Birmingham, Alabama, paper had a headline on the sports page: "The Most Exciting Moment of My Life." It showed a picture of Jack Nicklaus writing out a \$5,000 check for charity. As a matter of fact, it was the second \$5,000 check he had written. It happened because of a game of golf he lost. He lost to a man by the name of Charley Boswell.

Boswell, who lived in Birmingham, was a remarkable athlete. He was the captain of the Alabama football team that played in the 1938 Rose Bowl. After graduation, Boswell eventually won a place with baseball's Atlanta Crackers in the minor leagues in 1941. However, shortly after World War II broke out Boswell was drafted. As a captain in the infantry he and his men were sent to Germany. During a battle near the town of Lindern, Boswell rushed to pull a wounded American soldier from a burning Sherman tank. The tank exploded in Boswell's face, throwing him clear of the vehicle but leaving him permanently blinded. Still wanting to compete athletically, during his rehabilitation he tried a number of sports, but none satisfied his need to compete. That is, until rehabilitation specialist Corporal Kenny Gleason encouraged Boswell to try golf. Boswell had never played golf even when he could see and, according to his memoirs, he approached his first swing with skepticism. However, after Gleason helped him line up his stance, a 200-yard drive down the middle of the fairway convinced him otherwise. Boswell rapidly improved in his game. For nine holes he could shoot par golf. He could hit a ball he couldn't even see. The caddy would rattle the pin in the cup, and the noise told him where to putt. Boswell had a remarkable career in which he won 16 national championships (the last in 1970 in Greensboro, North Carolina) and 11 international championships (ending his international run in 1967 in Hamilton, Ontario).

Now back to the original story. Nicklaus went to Birmingham to help raise money for a Boys' Ranch and he donated \$5,000. They had a banquet to honor Nicklaus for helping with the fundraiser and for his sizeable gift. Halfway through the meal, Charley Boswell stood at a table in the

back of the room. "Mr. Nicklaus, they tell me you play a little golf." There was silence. "Yes, I've been known to play a round or two." "So do I, and I think I can beat you. I'll play you nine holes of golf. If you can beat me, I'll give \$5,000 to the Boys' Club. And, if I beat you, you give another \$5,000. To make the contest fun, exciting, and fair, you choose the course where we play, and I'll choose the time we play -- day or night."

Guess what time Charley chose? Night, of course. The Birmingham paper had a full length picture of Nicklaus writing out his second \$5,000 check. The headline said "The Most Exciting Moment of My Life." Someone asked him about that headline. Why had he made that statement? "You have won every trophy, award, honor, and accolade. Why would this be so exciting?" Nicklaus replied "I met a person today who refuses to let fear control his life."

Spiritually, the opposite of fear is not boldness, but faith. God has not given us a spirit of fear, but of power, love, and a sound mind (2 Timothy 1:7). Exercise your faith this week.
