Freedom for Prisoners

Today we welcome **Sing for the King Ministries**, a group specifically called to do prison ministries. At the beginning of His ministry, Jesus read these words from Isaiah, and applied them to Himself: "The Spirit of the Lord is upon Me, because He has anointed Me...He has sent me to proclaim freedom for the prisoners" (Isaiah 61:1-2, Luke 4:18).

In December 1944 German Lutheran Pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer was celebrating his last Christmas on the earth. While only 39 years old, he had spoken publicly against the Nazi regime, and was promptly arrested and sent to prison. He would not survive the war. As Christmas approached, Bonhoeffer was sitting alone in his cell with his journal when the thought occurred to him: "How like being in a prison cell is the Advent of our Lord Jesus Christ. We putter around inside our stone walls and iron bars, and we long to be free. But the door is locked, and it can only be opened from the outside" (taken from Bonhoeffer's best-known book, *The Cost of Discipleship*). Being a disciple of Christ ultimately cost Bonhoeffer his life. A faith not worth dying for isn't worth living for.

At Christmas the Angel Tree ministry of Prison Fellowship encourages the purchase and delivery of gifts to children of prisoners, praying that those in prison find inner freedom by knowing Jesus Christ. Jesus said, "If the Son makes you free, you are free indeed" (John 8:36).

Rev. Dr. Robert Leroe, a pastor who has visited people in state correctional facilities, suggests to

them that perhaps God was using this crisis experience to "get their attention." While most agree, usually someone adds, "I wish He had tried something else!" Leroe's usual answer for that inevitable reply is, "Perhaps He did, but you weren't listening." He says the greatest thing is when prisoners become free on the inside, having been set free through trust in Christ.

Someone said that people are enslaved by what they give power to. Peter wrote, "A man is a slave to whatever has mastered him" (2 Peter 2:19). We seek to escape reality only to find ourselves in prisons of indifference, materialism, and mindless recreation, and we look back to the freedom Christ made possible, inner freedom that helps us be victorious regardless of our circumstances. In Galatians Paul says, "It is for freedom that Christ has set us free. Stand firm, then, and do not let yourselves be burdened again by a yoke of slavery" (5:1). Freedom is life controlled by truth and motivated by love. Bondage is life controlled by lies and motivated by self-interest.

Zanzibar, an old city in East Africa, was the home of East Africa's largest slave market for nearly 300 years. However, about 150 years ago something happened there. A man walked into Zanzibar with a message of freedom for those who were bound by slavery. David Livingstone set thousands of slaves free, and even today the name of David Livingstone commands deep respect in East Africa. In Zanzibar, a Christian Church now sits on the very site of the former slave market, and the very same platform that used to display slaves as they were being auctioned off, is now the platform that holds up the altar in that place of worship.

This is a picture of what Jesus does in the hearts and lives of all His elect. He sets them free indeed. He meets us at the very place of slavery in our lives. He meets us at our very point of shame, the very place where darkness is holding us captive, and He makes His grace reign in that very place, so that our hearts which used to be enslaved are freed from sin and transformed into places of worship.
